Killing of George Floyd

On May 25, 2020, George Floyd, a 46-year-old black American man, was killed in Minneapolis, Minnesota, during an arrest for allegedly using a counterfeit bill. [1] Derek Chauvin, a white police officer, knelt on Floyd's neck for almost eight minutes [note 1] while Floyd was handcuffed and lying face down, begging for his life and repeatedly saying "I can't breathe". [4][5] Officers J. Alexander Kueng and Thomas Lane further restrained Floyd, while officer Tou Thao prevented bystanders from intervening. [6][7]:6:24 During the final two minutes, [8] Floyd was motionless and had no pulse [9][10] while Chauvin ignored onlookers' pleas to remove his knee, which he did not do until medics told him to. [11]:7:30

The following day, after videos made by witnesses and security cameras became public, [12][13][14] all four officers were fired. Two autopsies found Floyd's death to be a homicide. [15] Chauvin was initially charged with third-degree murder and second-degree manslaughter, [16][17] to which was later added second-degree murder. The three other officers were charged with aiding and abetting second-degree murder. [4][18][10]

Floyd's death triggered subsequent protests against police brutality, police racism, and lack of police accountability.^[19] In early June, the Minneapolis City Council took action to ban chokeholds and require police officers to intervene against the use of excessive force by other officers, and voted an intent to restructure the police department as a "new community-based system of public safety". ^{[20][21]} The Minneapolis Police Chief cancelled contract negotiations with the police union and announced plans to bring in outside experts to examine how the union contract can be restructured to provide transparency and "flexibility for true reform". ^[22]

COVID-19 Challenge Grant

We are pleased to announce a challenge grant funding up to \$15,000 for alumni of our program and other policy-oriented technologists to work on projects to mitigate the effects of COVID-19.

At the Aspen Tech Policy Hub, we take tech experts, teach them the policy process through an inresidence fellowship program in the Bay Area, and encourage them to develop outside-the-box solutions to society's problems. We model ourselves after tech incubators like Y Combinator, but train new policy thinkers and focus the impact of their ideas. We're building new ideas at the intersection of civic technology and policy making. You can see our past projects here.

While the focus of the Hub to date has been our 10-week <u>full-time incubator fellowship</u>, we have long planned to expand our programming to support the tech and policy ecosystem in other ways, including by supporting challenge grants for players across the ecosystem to propose timely projects. In light of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the need for civic technologists to build new tools and policy solutions to support communities in need, we thought it was imperative to pilot this model and announce one such opportunity now.

As such, we are accepting applications from technologists for projects that will help mitigate the effects of COVID-19. Winning teams will be allotted up to \$15,000 over three months to execute their projects.
